Privacy Policy - Applicants

Foundation Associate Professor Ragna Lorentzen's scholarship

The Foundation's activities are carried out to fulfil the Foundation's purpose, as stated in the Charter of the Foundation. This privacy policy describes how we collect and process your personal data in connection with the fulfilment of the Foundation's purpose.

In accordance with §11 of Act no. 580 of 1 June 2014 on "Public research institutions' commercial activities and cooperation with foundations", DPU, Aarhus University provides secretarial assistance to the Foundation. DPU is responsible for maintaining and updating lists of board members, convening and holding meetings as well as administering grant applications and grants.

The Foundation is responsible for its own processing of personal data, and DPU is the data controller for its processing of personal data as part of providing secretarial services. You can read more about AU's processing of personal data here.

Both parties disclose personal data about grant applicants, grant recipients and board members to the other party in connection with fulfilling the Foundation's purpose.

The types of personal data we collect are:

- General personal data: Name, citizenship, CPR.nr., e-mail, address, telephone number, account number, student number, AUID, education, place of education, study activity, financial circumstances incl. the household's family circumstances and information about any study trip.
- Sensitive personal data: Ancestry/ethnicity and other sensitive information that you voluntarily share with us, such as illness or disability.

The lawful basis for processing and using your personal data by the Foundation is General Data Protection Regulation no. 2016/679 on the protection of persons regaring the processing of personal data.

- Article 6(1)(b) of the General Data Protection Regulation, according to which an application for a grant/foundation is considered necessary prior to entering into a contract for the distribution of grants and/or funds
- Article 6(1)(c) of the General Data Protection Regulation, according to which
 we may be legally obliged to process personal data in connection with reporting to public authorities such as SKAT
- Article 6(1)(f) of the General Data Protection Regulation, according to which
 processing of your personal data may be necessary to fulfil the Fund's legitimate interests in fulfilling its purpose.

In connection with the fulfilment of the above purposes, your personal data may be disclosed to external parties with whom we enter into agreements for the administration of the Fund or if required by relevant legislation. For example, the fund's auditor, Danske Bank and SKAT. The Foundation does not sell your information to any third parties.

Storage and access to personal data

Your personal data is processed and stored by the Foundation in personally identifiable form for as long as it is necessary for the purpose, and we are obliged to do so due to legal requirements, including the Bookkeeping Act and the Archives Act. AU's EDRM system is used to store the personal data necessary for the provision of secretariat services to the Foundation. When your personal data is no longer necessary for processing, it will be anonymized, transferred to the Danish National Archives or deleted.

You have the following rights if we process your personal data:

 Right of access - You have the right to see the personal data that the data controller processes about you and obtain a range of information about the processing.

- Right to rectification You have the right to have incorrect/incorrect personal data about yourself corrected.
- Right to erasure or "right to be forgotten".
- Right to restriction of processing.
- Right to data portability In certain cases, you have the right to receive your personal data and to request that the personal data be transferred from one controller to another.
- Right to object You have the right to object to otherwise lawful processing of your personal data.
- Right not to be subject to automated decision-making based solely on automated processing, including profiling.
